

SECRET SOCIETIES/GANG ACTIVITY

Code **JICF** Issued **9/04**

Purpose: To establish the basic structure for the center's prohibition of student secret societies and gang activities.

The board finds that gangs that initiate, advocate or promote activities threatening the safety or well being of persons or property on center grounds or gangs that disrupt the center environment are harmful to the educational process. The center prohibits the use of hand signals, graffiti or the presence of any apparel, jewelry, accessory or manner of grooming that, by virtue of its color, arrangement, trademark, symbol or any other attribute indicates or implies membership or affiliation with a group that presents a clear and present danger contrary to the center environment and educational objectives.

The center prohibits incidents involving initiations, hazings, intimidations or related activities of such group affiliations that are likely to cause bodily danger, physical harm, or personal degradation or disgrace resulting in physical or mental harm to students.

The administration will establish procedures and regulations to ensure the discipline of any student wearing, carrying or displaying gang paraphernalia; exhibiting behavior or gestures that symbolize gang membership; or causing or participating in activities that intimidate or affect the attendance of another student.

The administration will provide inservice training in gang behavior and characteristics to facilitate staff identification of students at-risk and promote membership in authorized center groups or activities as an alternative.
